## Big Valley Rancheria's Tule Boat Festival

Our Tule Boat Festival began in the Summer of 2001 from the desire of one of our Tribal Elders, Nelson Hopper, to teach the Big Valley Community the art of making the traditional Pomo tule boat.

The festival has undergone many changes over the years to become a fun filled 3-day event that has an annual unifying theme and logo. Our 2018 theme was "Protecting our Tules and our Culture" so we planted tules along the shoreline during the festival. We have had various demonstrations over the years such as edible aquifers, tule dolls making, basket weaving, soap root identification, and our Pomo language presentation. We also invite Tribal Dancer Groups to the festival, and each day we are blessed with their dances. Approximately 325 people attended the Tule Boat Festival daily, and we have boat teams from the local area and far away as Buena Vista.

On the first day the teams focus on collecting enough Tules to build a boat. We serve lunch and an early dinner each day.

On the second day the teams put the boat together. Both children and adults build the boats, and the Tribe provides an instructor to assist with the boat building. Everyone gets a chance to shop at the many vendors that are there all 3 days. We have all type of vendors ranging from EPA information and demonstrations, Native American jewelry and art, and all types of food. The Tribe works to make the festival a zero-waste event, using reusable or compostable supplies during the meals, and composting all food scraps.

On the third day the teams race the tule boats that they made. It is a fun and exciting day to watch the many people that have come together from near and far to race their boats.

Big Valley Rancheria's Annual Tule Boat Festival gives people the opportunity to learn the skills of traditional tule boat making, and to come together to enjoy a fun educational event.



   Tule Boat team/individual races followed by BBQ lunch and awards. Races at 12 noon!



Thursday July 26- Saturday July 28, 2012






July 28<sup>th</sup> Lunch at 2:00pm, with tule boat races immediately after. Followed by dancing, raffle and awards ceremony.


